Georg Forster Research Fellowship for Sustainable Development

The Georg Forster Research Fellowship, offered by the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation, supports researchers from developing and emerging countries with above-average qualifications. It enables them to conduct research in collaboration with a host at a German institution. The fellowship, aimed particularly at female scientists. They offers €3,200 per month, plus additional benefits, and lasts from 6 to 18 months, with flexible options for dividing the stay.

World Bank Scholarship Program

The Joint Japan/World Bank Graduate Scholarship Program (JJ/WBGSP) offers scholarships to citizens of selected developing countries for master's programs in development-related fields at 42 universities worldwide. Horizon Europe Programme: Resource Efficiency of PV in Production, Use and Disposal

Civil Society Organizations Partnering with UN Women Lebanon on Women's Economic Empowerment (New)

UN Women Lebanon invites civil society organizations to apply for partnerships focused on women's economic empowerment in crisis-affected areas, with two main lots. Call for EOIs: USAID End Wildlife Crime Program (New)

The U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) is inviting proposals for the End Wildlife Crime (EWC) Program, aimed at combating wildlife trafficking and conserving biodiversity across Southeast Asia. This program focuses on strengthening civil society organizations (CSOs) and regional coalitions through advocacy, social mobilization, and behavior change campaigns, with an emphasis on inclusivity of underrepresented groups like women, youth, and Indigenous Peoples. Grants ranging from \$25,000 to \$200,000 will be awarded to eligible NGOs, coalitions, and private sector organizations with operations in multiple USAID EWC focus countries. Eligible applicants must have experience in social behavior change, wildlife conservation, or related fields within the past five years.
